

## **JBP Method for Reading:**

To use if Mapping the Passage has not worked for you!

- Look at **Questions 1<sup>st</sup>**
- Any time a line number is referenced in a question, **note that question # in the margin of the text that corresponds to the question**  
Ex: If question #5 specifically mentions lines 13-15 of the passage, write **5** in the margin of the text next to lines 13-15.
- This will allow you to focus your reading specific to the questions and where the important info is located.

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## **Paired Passages** (pg 353)

**2 passages that are placed together with a group of questions after**

**\*Synthesis type questions\***

### **KEY: DIVIDE & Conquer!**

- Read passage 1
  - Then answer its questions (they will be the first 2-4 Qs)
- Read passage 2
  - Then answer its questions (they will be the 2-4 Qs)
- Answer synthesis or Compare/Contrast questions
  - These are **about BOTH passages and are the last 1 or 2 questions**

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## **Parallel POE** (Process of Elimination)

Combination of Princeton Review & JBP Methods

**Set of Paired Questions (2 questions that work together; the 2nd question asks for evidence for the 1st one)**

- **Start with 2nd question "best evidence"**
  - **Do this because the 2nd question gives line #s to reference for the answer!**

- This makes it quicker!

- The correct answer to the 1st MUST be supported by the answer to the 2nd (this is the EVIDENCE! If there is an evidence answer that doesn't support an answer to the first question, it is WRONG!)

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**Infographics** (graphs, tables, data, images)

- Show or expand info from reading

Steps:

1) Read the question

2) Examine the graphic

3) Predict and answer

- Make notes when reading infographic (trends, relationships, etc.)
- Identify units of measurement, labels, & titles
- Circle info on graphic directly related to question
